Course Description:

This course is based on current scientific literature and will provide the clinician evidence based tools and strategies for comprehensive patient care.

The Evidence-based Decision Making (EBDM) process will be discussed with regard to periodontal risk assessment protocols, salivary diagnostics, and progressive treatment planning. Advantages of ultrasonic instrumentation will be examined as demonstrated in the current research for obtaining successful clinical outcomes. Hands-on practice will be included.

Course Objectives:

- Apply the Evidence-based Decision Making (EBDM) process by identifying current clinical gaps for optimal patient care.
- Examine the unique relationship between oral and systemic conditions pertaining to the patient's risk factors.
- Discuss the use of salivary diagnostics for the presence of diabetes which identify C-reactive protein and other biomarkers which play a role in periodontal disease.
- Clarify the role of ultrasonic instrumentation in the delivery of successful preventive and therapeutic debridement supported by current research.
