MINUTES

JANUARY 29, 2016

A meeting of the BridgeValley Community and Technical College Board of Governors (Board) was held on Friday, January 29, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in Room 006 on BridgeValley's South Charleston campus.

Board members present: Greg Barker, Mark Dempsey, Tom Dover, Jane Harkins, Rachel Harper, David Lewia, Karen Price, Don Stewart, Jan Vineyard, Judy Whipkey, and Michelle Wicks. Board members absent: Donna Atkinson. Also in attendance were Representatives from Suttle and Stalknaker, BridgeValley Foundation Chair Rocky Hackworth, President Jo Harris, faculty, and staff from BridgeValley.

I. Call to Order

Chair Lewia called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

II. Roll Call

Roll was taken by Alicia Syner noting that a quorum was present.

III. Approval of Minutes

Jan Vineyard moved to approve the meeting minutes of November 20, 2015. Don Stewart seconded the motion. Motion carried.

IV. Board Reports

a. Resolution and Recognition—Dr. Pat Hunt

President Harris, Chair Lewia, and Rocky Hackworth presented Dr. Pat Hunt with a resolution, attached as part of the minutes of the Board, thanked her for her years of service to the institution, and wished her a successful retirement.

b. Action Item: Approval of Revised Rule C-9

Mark Dempsey moved to approve the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, that the BridgeValley Community and Technical College Board of Governors approves the revision of BOG Rule C-9—Freshman Assessment and Placement Standards for distribution to constituencies and posting for a 30-day comment period and submission to the West Virginia Council at the conclusion of the period if no substantive comments are received.

Karen Price seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

V. President's Report

President Harris provided an update on recent activities since the November meeting. Highlights included the establishment of a \$700,000 gift for the endowed "BrickStreet Scholars" program by BrickStreet Foundation, Inc., a spotlight on the Gestamp Apprenticeship program during the Governor's State of the State Address, and participation in the Workforce Development Institute.

VI. Administrative Items

a. Action Item: Approval of Audit Report

Representatives from Suttle and Stalnaker presented an overview of the audit to the Board noting that BridgeValley received an unqualified opinion for this audit and had no material weaknesses.

Mark Dempsey moved to approve the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, that the BridgeValley Community and Technical College Board of Governors approves the audit of the BridgeValley Community and Technical College Financial Statements for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015.

Jan Vineyard seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

b. Action Item: Approval of 2015-2020 Master Plan

Jan Vineyard moved the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, that the BridgeValley Community and Technical College Board of Governors approves the 2015-2020 Master Plan, updated to reflect alignment with the 2015-2020 West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education Compact.

Karen Price seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

c. Information Item: FY 2015-2016 Budget Update for BridgeValley

Dr. Pat Hunt provided a budget update comparing year-to-date actual spending compared to budget for the first half of this fiscal year.

d. Information Item: Facility Cost Comparison for BridgeValley

As requested by the Board, Dr. Pat Hunt provided a facility cost comparison analysis between the Montgomery and South Charleston campuses.

e. Information Item: Holiday Calendar for BridgeValley

The holiday calendar for July 2016 through June 2017 was provided to the Board per WV Code 18B-26 and BOG Rule B-4.

f. Information Item: 2010-2015 State Compact Performance Summary for BridgeValley

Dr. Harris shared the most recent summary report for BridgeValley as provided by the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education.

g. Information Item: Legislative Update

Dr. Harris summarized Council and college discussions for legislative consideration. The Board requested to be added to the legislative updates listserv.

VII. Academic and Student Affairs

a. Information Item: Program Inventory Evaluation

Dr. Mallory, Senior Vice President for Academic and Student Affairs, described the process used for program inventory evaluation. Each division dean was tasked with identifying programs based on costs, enrollment, and graduation rates, along with job opportunities and placement of graduates. The compiled data was distributed to the Board for review. Deans were available for questions.

VIII. Workforce and Economic Development Report

Jeff Wyco, Senior Vice President of Workforce and Economic Development, distributed a report detailing recent workforce and economic development training, meetings, and revenue received to date. He also noted that the Advanced Technology Center website is almost complete.

IX. Executive Session—Personnel and Legal Contracts

Mark Dempsey called for a motion to enter Executive Session in accordance with WV Code §6-9A-4 to discuss personnel matters and legal contracts.

Karen Price seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Upon conclusion of Executive Session, the Board reconvened in open session.

X. Additional Board Action and Comments

a. President Harris' Retirement

Chair Lewia announced that during Executive Session, President Harris announced her retirement effective July 5, 2016.

Mark Dempsey moved that the Board accept President Harris' retirement effective July 5, 2016.

Jane Harkins seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

b. Presidential Search Committee

Tom Dover moved the adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved, that Board Chair, David Lewia, be authorized to appoint the Presidential Search Committee to consist of the Board Chair, David Lewia; the Board Vice Chair, Jan Vineyard; Board Member, Mark Dempsey; Board Member, Karen Price; Faculty Senate Chair, Amanda McClellan; Classified Staff Chair, Carla Blankenbuehler; Student Government President, Rachel Harper; and one member from the BridgeValley Foundation Board.

Further Resolved, that the Presidential Search Committee be authorized to act on behalf of the Board in making determinations in order for the Board to move forward with the presidential search.

Further Resolved, that the Board approves Michelle Bissell, Chief Human Resources Officer for BridgeValley, as the point of contact and liaison to the WV Council during the presidential search.

Mark Dempsey seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

c. Legal Contracts

Mark Dempsey moved to approve the following resolution:

Resolved, that President Harris communicate with the WV Regional Technology Park that continued negotations for the 2015-2016 facility agreement presented for Buildings 2000 and 704 are necessary. Additionally, the Board directs Dr. Harris to

provide Tech Park with an alternative agreement that provides for payment of central administrative costs for Buildings 2000 and 704 that is equivalent to ATC square footage costs, with paragraph noting the realization that further negotations may ensue.

Don Stewart seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

RECOMMENDED RESOLUTION: Resolved, that the BridgeValley Community and

Technical College Board of Governors approves a \$270 (7%) annual increase for resident tuition and a \$642 (7%) annual increase for non-resident

tuition.

Further Resolved, that the BridgeValley Community and Technical College Board of Governors approves a \$424 (11%) annual increase for resident tuition and a \$1,009 (11%) annual increase for non-resident tuition, if State Appropriations are reduced in FY 2017 by 4%. The combination of FY 2016 and FY 2017 reductions would equate to an 8% reduction.

Community and Technical College Board of
Governors approves the special fees and program

fees as recommended.

BACKGROUND:

West Virginia State Code §18B-10-1(k)(1) allows the governing boards for community and technical colleges to approve annual tuition and fees increases up to five percent (5%) without further approval by the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council). Further, West Virginia State Code §18B-10-1 requires the local governing boards to approve changes in non-resident tuition and fees, program fees, and special or operational fees.

Any changes approved by the Board will be taken to the Council for reporting purposes only at the April 28, 2016 meeting.

Historical Tuition and Fees

This chart reflects the past five years of tuition and fees for all colleges. As the chart notes, the 5-year increase per year has been modest for BridgeValley using the higher tuition rate. However, this chart does not reflect the larger increase of \$324 in FY 2014 for the South Charleston campus when the then two colleges aligned their tuition in anticipation of the consolidation.



Financial Health of BridgeValley

There are various ratios that the Council, as well as the Higher Learning Commission (HLC), uses to evaluate financial health. One of the most critical ones is the composite financial index or CFI which evaluates whether or not an institution has adequate financial resources. This ratio, as the name implies, is calculated by combining various other financial ratios – primary reserve, net operating, return on net assets, and viability. HLC has determined that when the CFI is below 1.0 for two consecutive years or below 0.0 in any given year, the institution is subject to a financial panel review. BridgeValley underwent this review for FY 2015 which has been submitted to HLC for approval. Factors that contributed to the negative ratio for FY2015 are the decrease in State Appropriations, decrease in Tuition and Fee revenue, increase in OPEB expense and the implementation of the new accounting principle, GASB 68, Financial Reporting for Pensions. The ratios for the last three years are as follows:

FY2013 -0.50 FY2014 -0.10 FY2015 -0.13

Another financial indicator used to evaluate financial health is the Number of Days of Cash available. The chart below was provided to the Council staff. BridgeValley ranks second highest among the CTCs by having 207 days of cash available.

Proposed Tuition Increases

The recommendation to increase tuition and fees are for the following reasons:

- Three years of reductions in state appropriations 7.5% reduction for FY 2014, 3.75% for FY 2015, and 4.45% reduction for FY 2016. FY 2017 appropriations will be \$7,411,115 or less as compared to FY 2013 appropriations of \$8,099,261 which also included a \$500,000 increase to partially fund operations for the Advanced Technology Center;
- The need to increase fund balances and improve the Composite Financial Index; and,
- The need to budget for a worse-case scenario of increased lease costs for the Tech Park leases.

This tuition increase is projected to generate revenues as the following charts reflects.

TAACCCT "Bridging the Gap" Update


A Department of Labor TAACCCT grant was awarded in the amount of \$25 million for West Virginia community colleges.
