

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
BRIDGEVALLEY COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGE
AND
WEST VIRGINIA STATE UNIVERSITY

This agreement is to articulate the Two-Plus-Two Program in Criminal Justice to the Bachelors of Science in Criminal Justice

This Articulation Agreement is entered into by and between BridgeValley Community and Technical College (hereafter referred to as BVCTC) and West Virginia State University (hereafter referred to as WVSU).

WHEREAS, the parties desire to encourage and facilitate the establishment of specific articulation provisions between institutions, and

WHEREAS, the parties intend to promote the two plus two concept of student's education experiences including a seamless transition from associate degree programs to baccalaureate degree programs to encourage the recognition of prior education efforts and students recognition of the importance of continuing their education, and

WHEREAS, the intent of this agreement is to facilitate the transfer of associate degree students from BVCTC to WVSU. The two plus two programs will provide students who achieve an Associate of Applied degree in Criminal Justice a process to transition into the Bachelors of Science in Criminal Justice program at WVSU.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree to cooperate in articulating programs in accordance with the terms set forth herein.

This agreement commits WVSU to accept credits earned at BVCTC as delineated in the suggested courses that are a part of this agreement.

Through this agreement, students are assured of acceptance of prior college courses and are offered a plan for completing a baccalaureate degree as efficiently as possible.

This articulation agreement shall remain in effect until terminated by either party by giving at least 365 days prior written notice of termination to the other party.

The parties to this agreement shall review the relationship every two years to assess its effectiveness and usefulness.

The parties to this agreement shall inform the other party promptly if the curricular requirements of the relevant programs change.

Both institutions will designate a contact person on their respective campuses to represent their interest and to carry out the program mutually agreed upon. These representatives will meet or otherwise communicate as needed to evaluate the program and propose changes.

Any minor changes, (course number, name, or designation), that are brought through the Academic Standards Committee or Education Police committee will not require review and reauthorization of this agreement only updates of the respective addendum. Major changes to program curriculums or course content changes will require notification to the impacted program leaders.
