

Guaranteed Admission Agreement

Between West Virginia University Parkersburg and Bridge Valley Community and Technical College

THIS GUARANTEED ADMISSION AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and amongst West Virginia University Parkersburg (WVUP) and Bridge Valley Community and Technical College (BVCTC).

I. PURPOSE

These guidelines are designed to facilitate and coordinate the articulation transfer processes and procedures, enhance advising, and promote the acceptance of equivalent courses/credits between WVUP and BVCTC allowing for an efficient and effective transition from an Associate degree to a Baccalaureate degree or to transfer to or from WVUP/BVCTC to WVUP/BVCTC.

II ELEMENTS OF THE AGREEMENT

A. Admissions Practices

1. WVUP encourages applications from articulating BVCTC students who wish to pursue a baccalaureate degree program at WVUP (post AS).
2. Articulating BVCTC students with graduate with an AS degree and have transferable GPA of at least 2.0 and are in good standing are guaranteed admission to WVUP. Guaranteed admission to WVUP does not mean such students are guaranteed admission to their articulated major without satisfying the WVUP major criteria.
3. Students transferring from BVCTC to the Child Development program must meet the same prerequisites, grade point average (GPA) and other native or transfer students applying to WVUP Child Development program.

B. Acceptance and Application of Credits

1. General Education- Transcripts of students completing a Child Development AS at WVUP will be reviewed by WVUP to determine which of the general education requirements are met.
2. Transferring BVCTC applicants must follow all course hierarchies as outlined by the approved WVUP articulation pathway.
3. College level course credits and grades accepted by WVUP are transferrable. Grades of F, I, or U will be considered failing grades generating 0.0 points in the incoming/starting WVUP CGPA calculation.
4. WVUP will evaluate courses/credits and grades accepted by Advanced Placement (AP), College-Level Examination Program (CLEP), and International Baccalaureate (IB) programs. WVUP also reserves the right to evaluate courses/credits earned at non-TES (Transfer Equivalency System) institutions. Credit is not guaranteed for these sources and will be reviewed for credit consistent with WVUP's standards and pre-established course equivalencies.
5. WVUP will maintain course equivalency information and make this information readily available to BVCTC.
6. All credits and grades accepted as transfer credit will be used in the calculation of the cumulative grade point average and total/earned credits. Transfer credits from community colleges and junior colleges are limited to seventy-two hours of lower-division courses. Students articulating from BVCTC will be required to complete their final 30 credit hours at WVUP.

C. Update/Report/Relationship

WVUP and BVCTC agree to review the agreement and relevant transfer course equivalencies annually, the BVCTC Child Development Coordinator as liaison for the purposes of monitoring this agreement.

D. Amendments and Term of Effect

1. The curriculum transfer guides in effect at the time a student first enrolls at BVCTC will be honored by WVUP.
2. All course-by-course transfer guides may be amended as needed.
3. This agreement will remain in effect for one year from signing or until terminated by either party upon written notice to the other party of an intention to terminate. Such notice will be effective only if given one hundred

eighty days prior to the intended date of termination. In the event that this agreement is terminated, the terms of the agreement contained herein will remain in effect for the BVCTC students accepted prior to the date of termination notice.

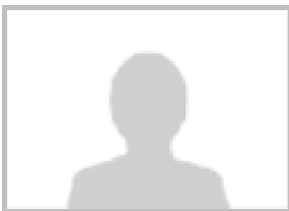
