

Certified Nursing Assistant

The Nursing Assistant course prepares individuals for an entry-level position in the health care field. Graduates work closely with patients under the supervision of a registered nurse. The nursing assistant provides important information on patient conditions to nurses and is vital to daily operations of a skilled nursing facility, home health organization, or hospital.

Students must pass a drug and back ground screening to complete the clinical requirements and take the state registry exam. Attendance in all classroom and clinical instructional hours is mandatory.

Cost: \$1,955

Includes 65 hours of classroom instruction, 55 hours of clinical instruction, textbooks, state registry exam, student uniform, drug screening, background check, required immunizations and all materials and supplies.

This class is approved for 3 hours of college credit. (A posting fee of \$25 per credit course applies)

This course meets all West Virginia state code requirements for the certified nursing assistant registry.
