## Requirements

- Be a minimum of 18 years of age
- Successfully complete a pre-assessment to gauge physical agility and fear of heights
- Pass a drug screening
- Possess Class A CDL Learner's Permit
- Complete a Department of Transportation Physical
- Have a valid unrestricted driver's license for a minimum of two years and be eligible to obtain a Class A CDL license
