BridgeValley Celebrates Giving Tuesday

South Charleston, WV - BridgeValley Community and Technical College celebrated Giving Tuesday on December 3rd by launching a \$3,000 campaign to raise funds for its new on-campus food pantry, Nourish Every Student Today (NEST). Giving Tuesday is a nationally recognized day of giving where millions of people around the world come together to support causes they believe in and communities in which they live.

This year, BridgeValley invited staff, faculty, students, board members, community members, and industry partners to give their time and talents to local organizations or donate to the BridgeValley Foundation. To date, the campaign has raised just over \$2,200. Donations are still being accepted online at www.bridgevalleyfoundation.com/donate and non-perishable food items may be dropped off to the Montgomery or South Charleston campuses throughout the year.

BridgeValley chose to launch the NEST project because 48 percent of community college students face food insecurity. "We want to overcome this obstacle and keep them focused on their education and on track to a brighter future", said Alicia Syner, executive director of institutional advancement.
