BridgeValley Community and Technical College Holding Public Forum to Evaluate President

(South Charleston, WV) - BridgeValley Community and Technical College will hold a public forum on Thursday, April 4 to evaluate the performance of the college's President, Dr. Eunice Bellinger.

Under the guidelines set forth in the Title 135 Legislative Rule/West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College's Education Series 5, the BridgeValley Board of Governors' Presidential Evaluation Committee will hold the forums.

The forums, which will be held concurrently on each of BridgeValley's campuses will solicit input from the public, including BridgeValley faculty, staff and students, with the evaluation focusing on how the president has upheld the position's duties and responsibilities, including BridgeValley's success and additional criteria established by the Board of Governors.

Each forum is scheduled from 5 to 6 p.m. BridgeValley's South Charleston forum will be held in Room 137/138 at 2001 Union Carbide Dr., while the Montgomery forum is at David Hall Auditorium, 619 2nd Ave.
